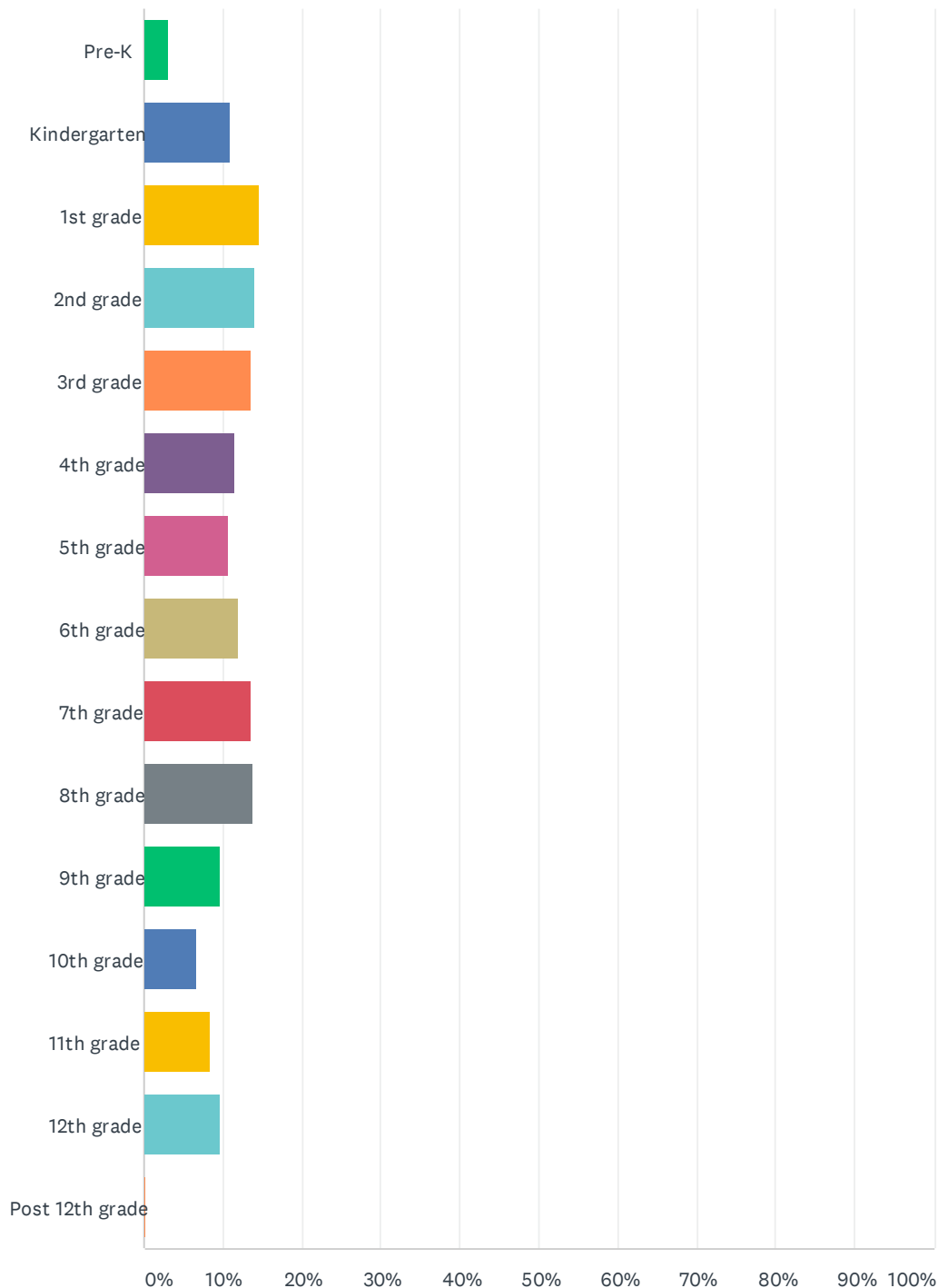


Q1 What grade (or grades) are your child(ren) in this school year?

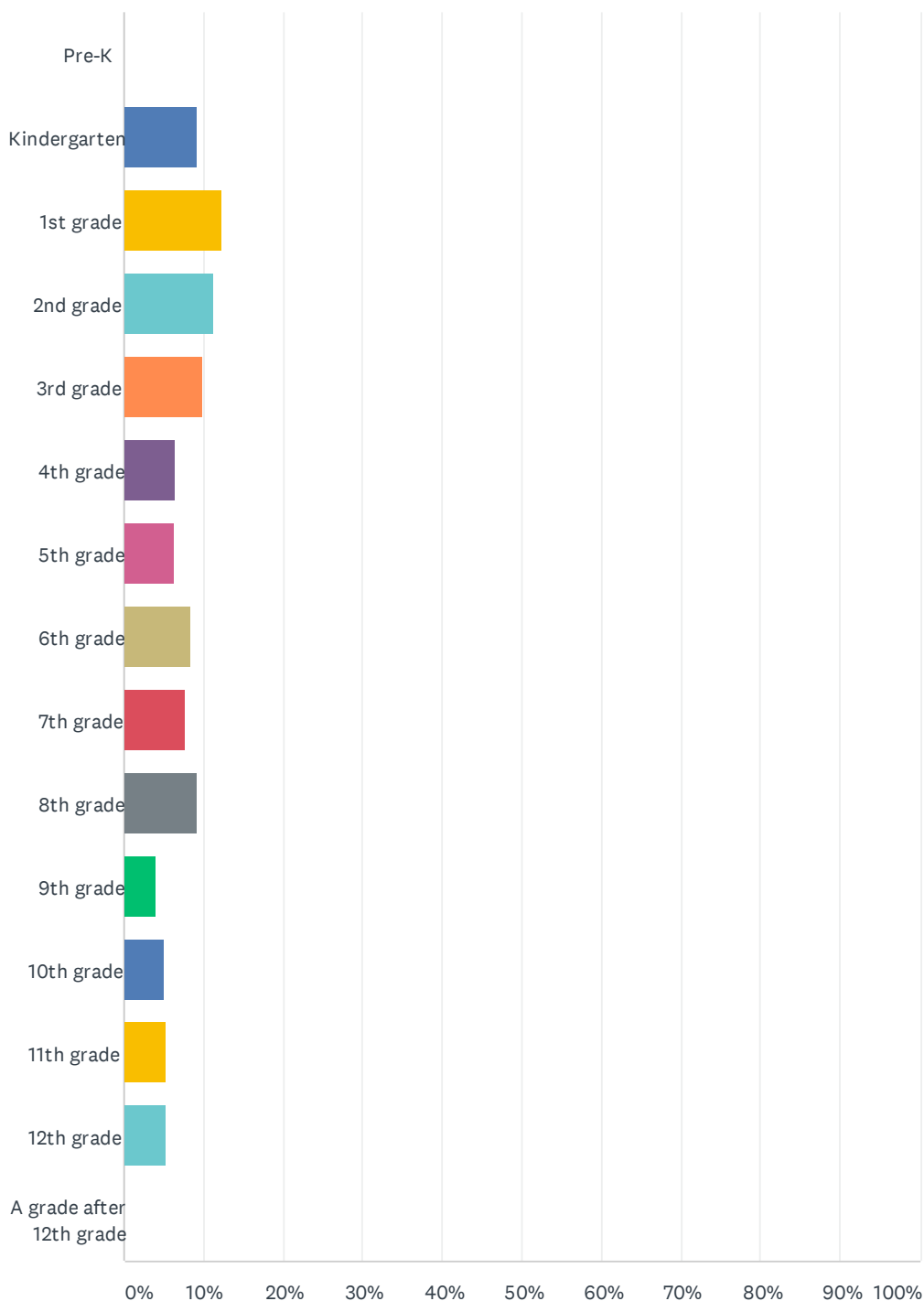

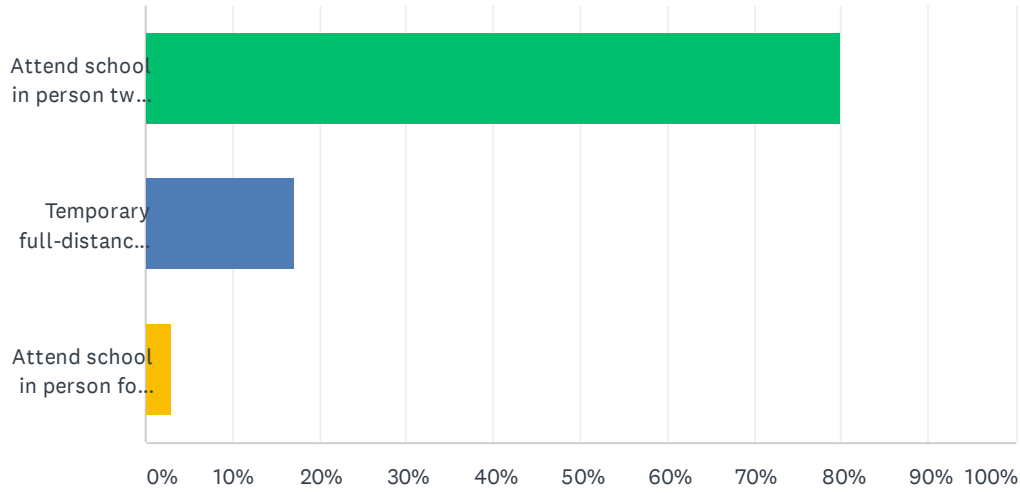

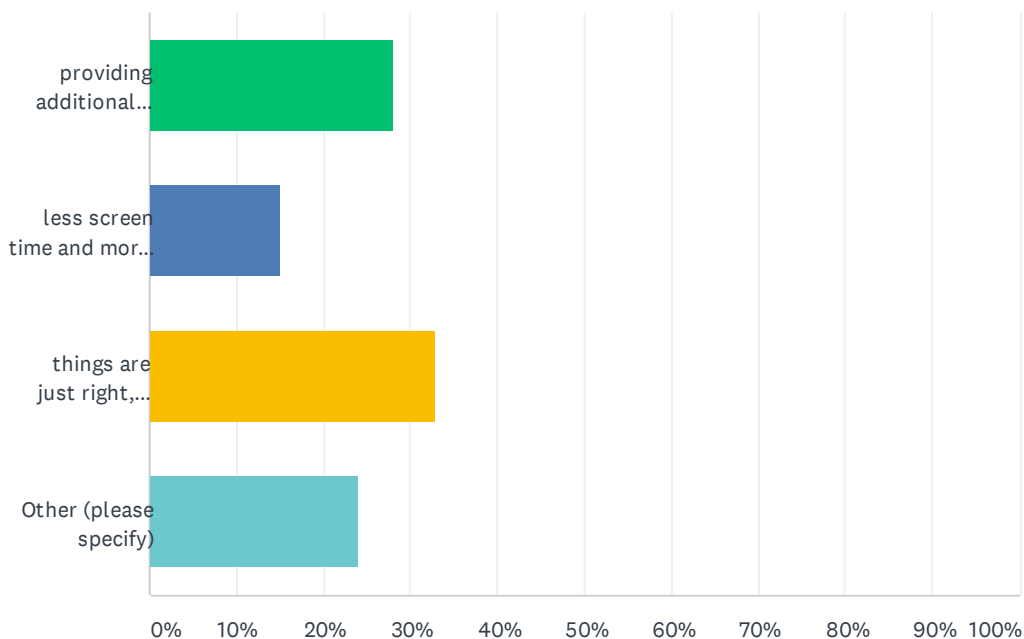

Q10 How meaningful is the current independent work that is assigned to your child?

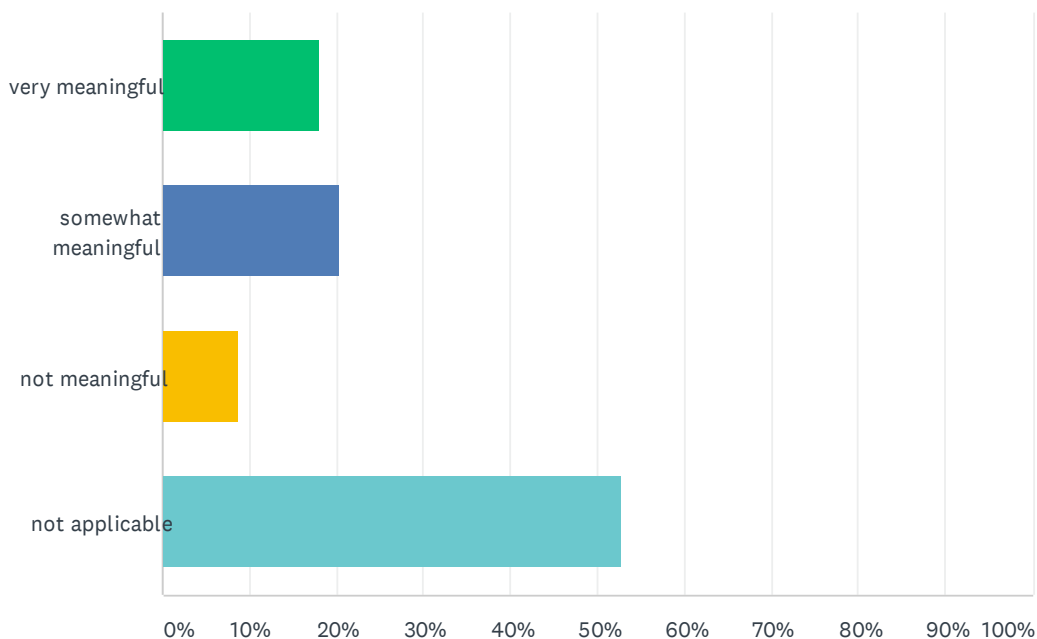

Q11 How meaningful have the supports provided by both paraprofessionals and tutors been for your child?

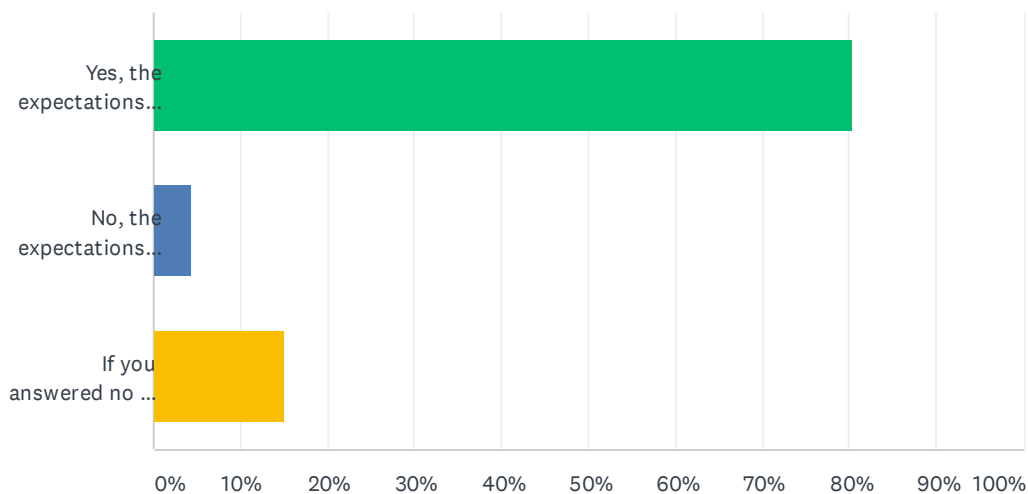

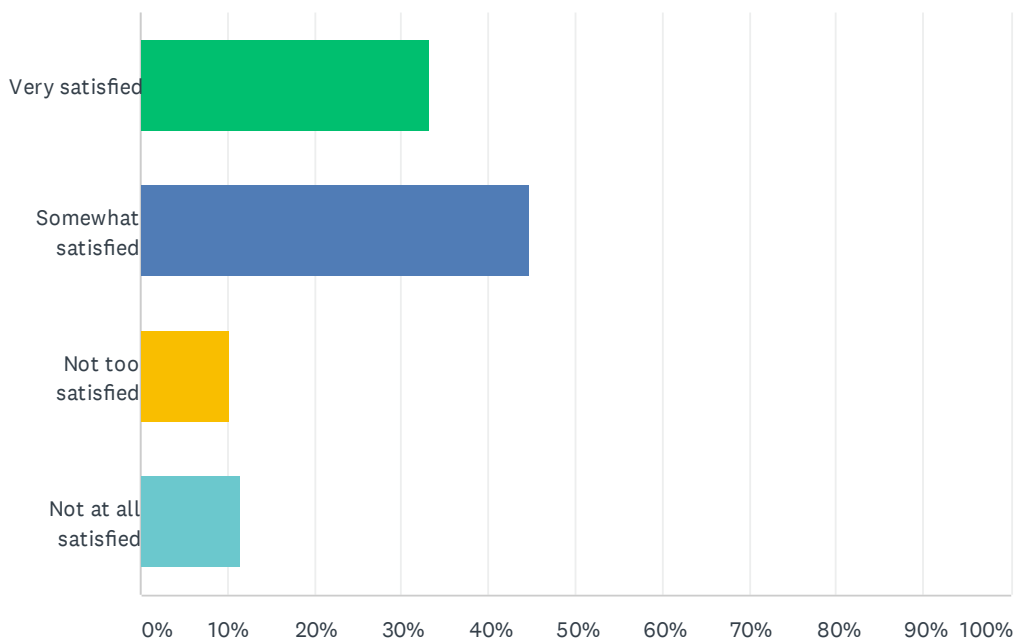

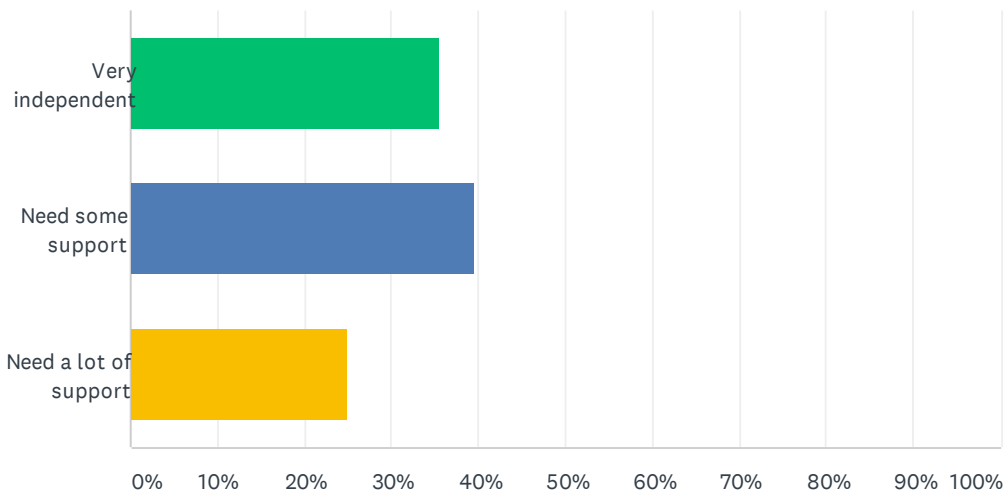

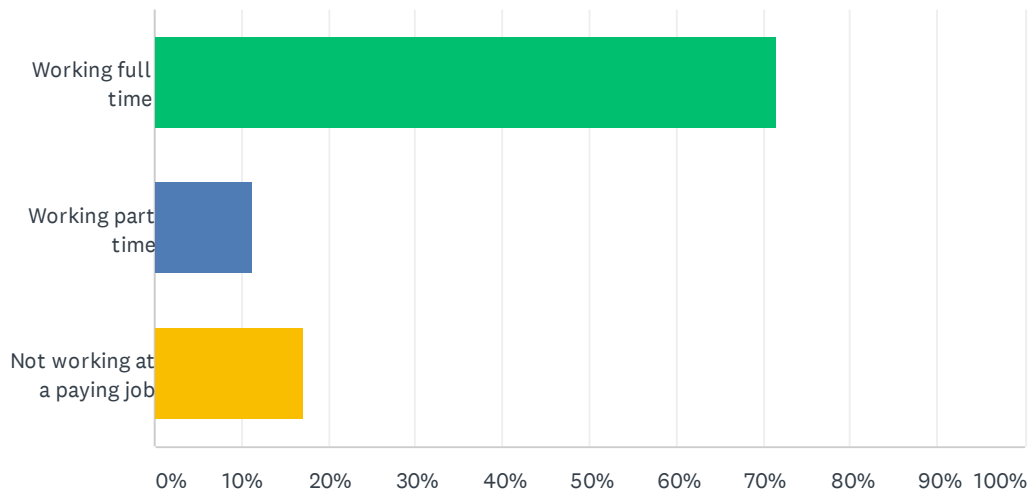

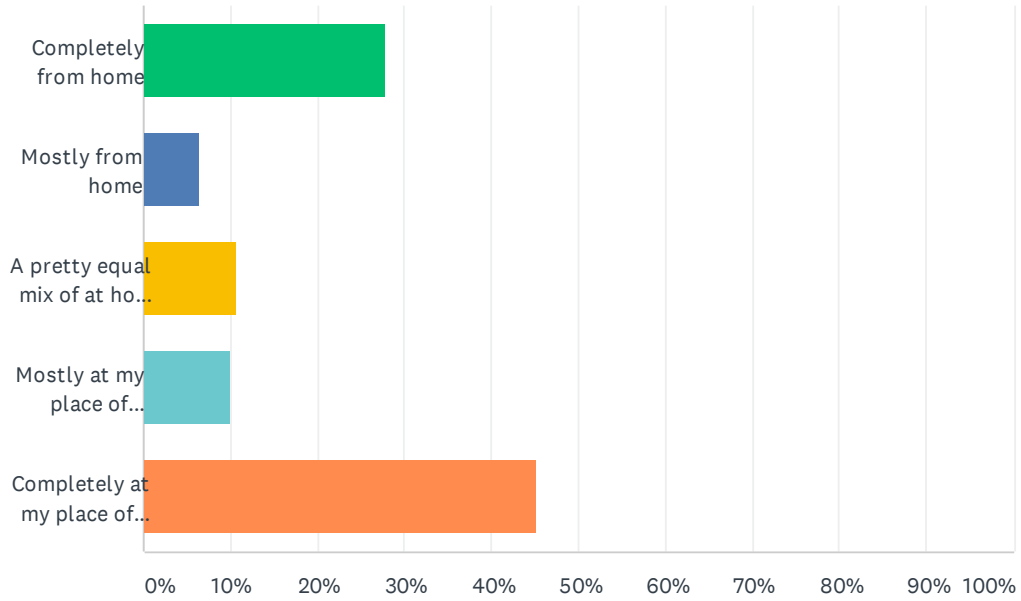

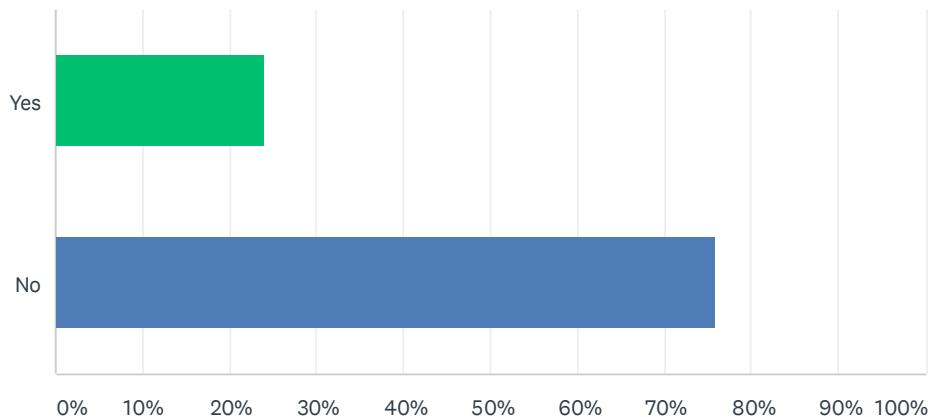
