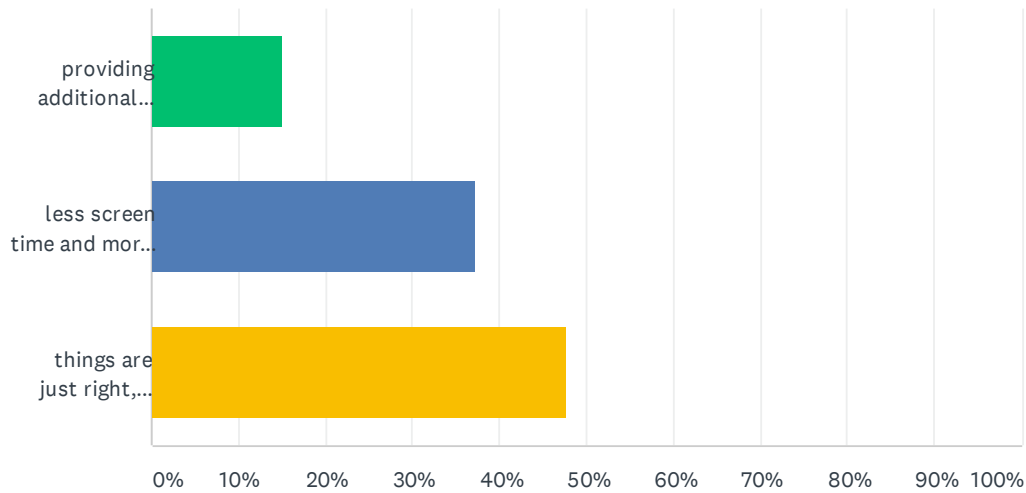

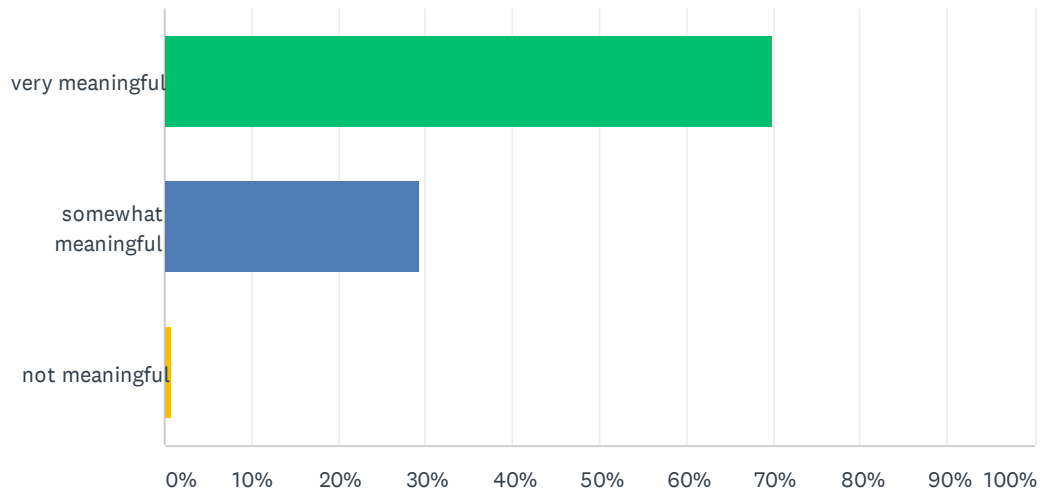

## Q8 How meaningful is the current independent work that is being assigned?

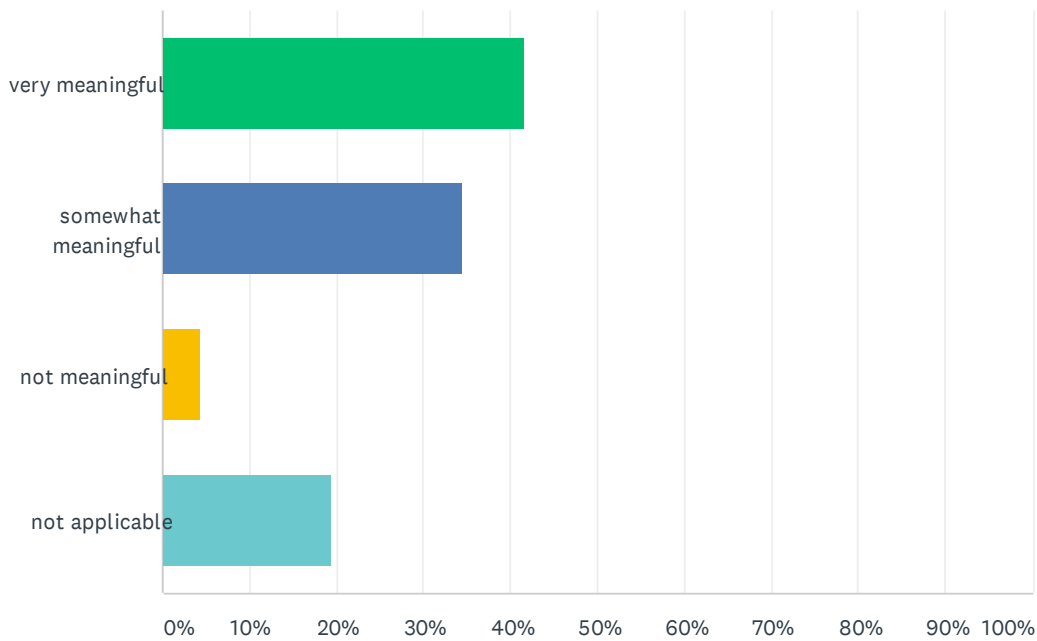

## Q9 How meaningful have the supports provided by both paraprofessionals and tutors been for your students?

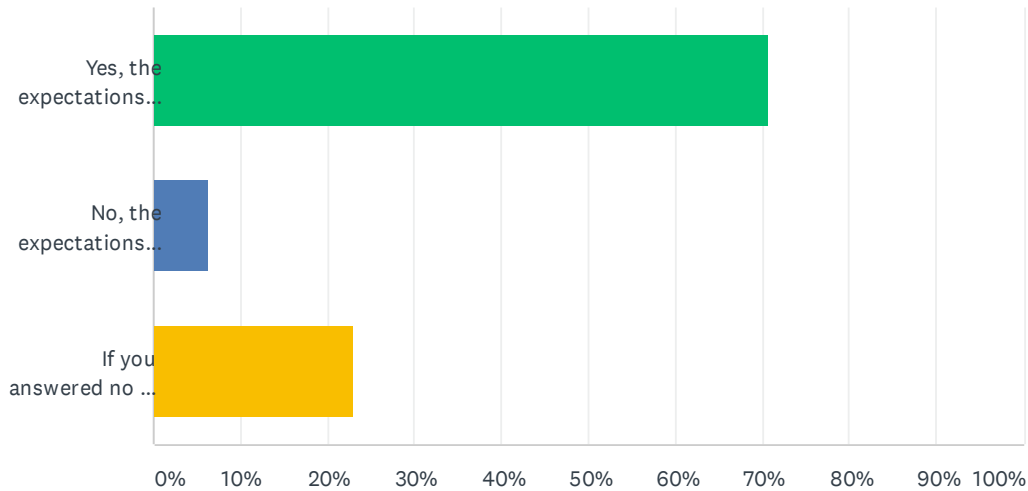

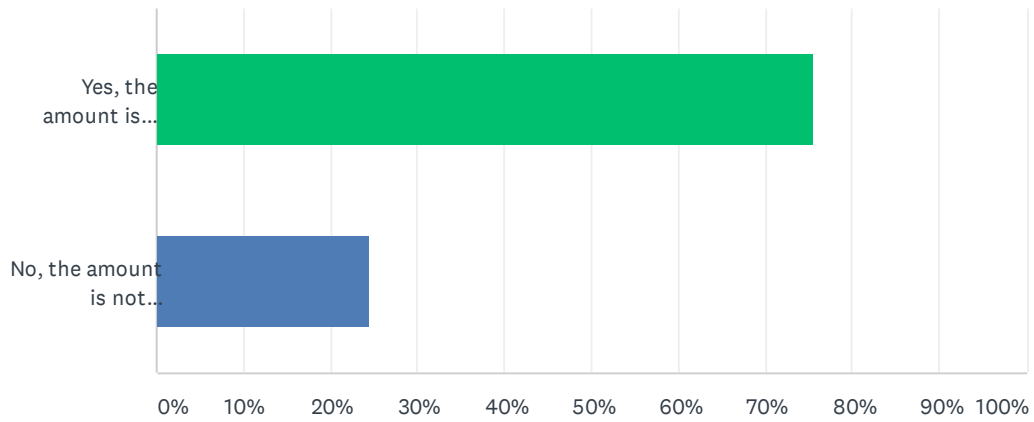

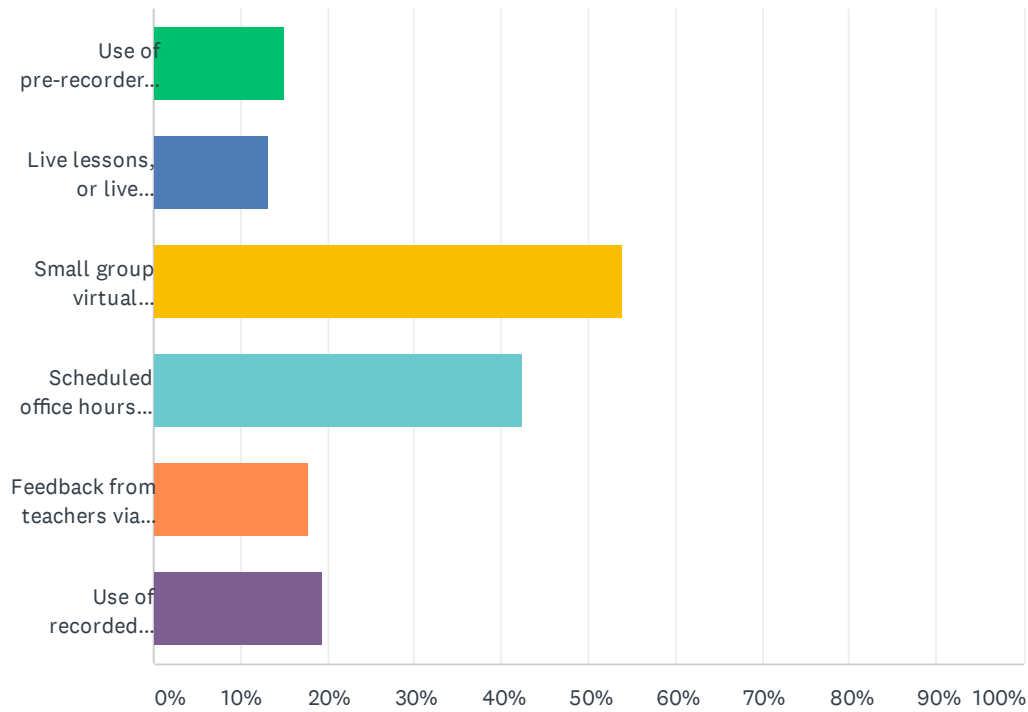

## Q12 Which do you wish you could do more of during remote hybrid or temporary full distance learning.

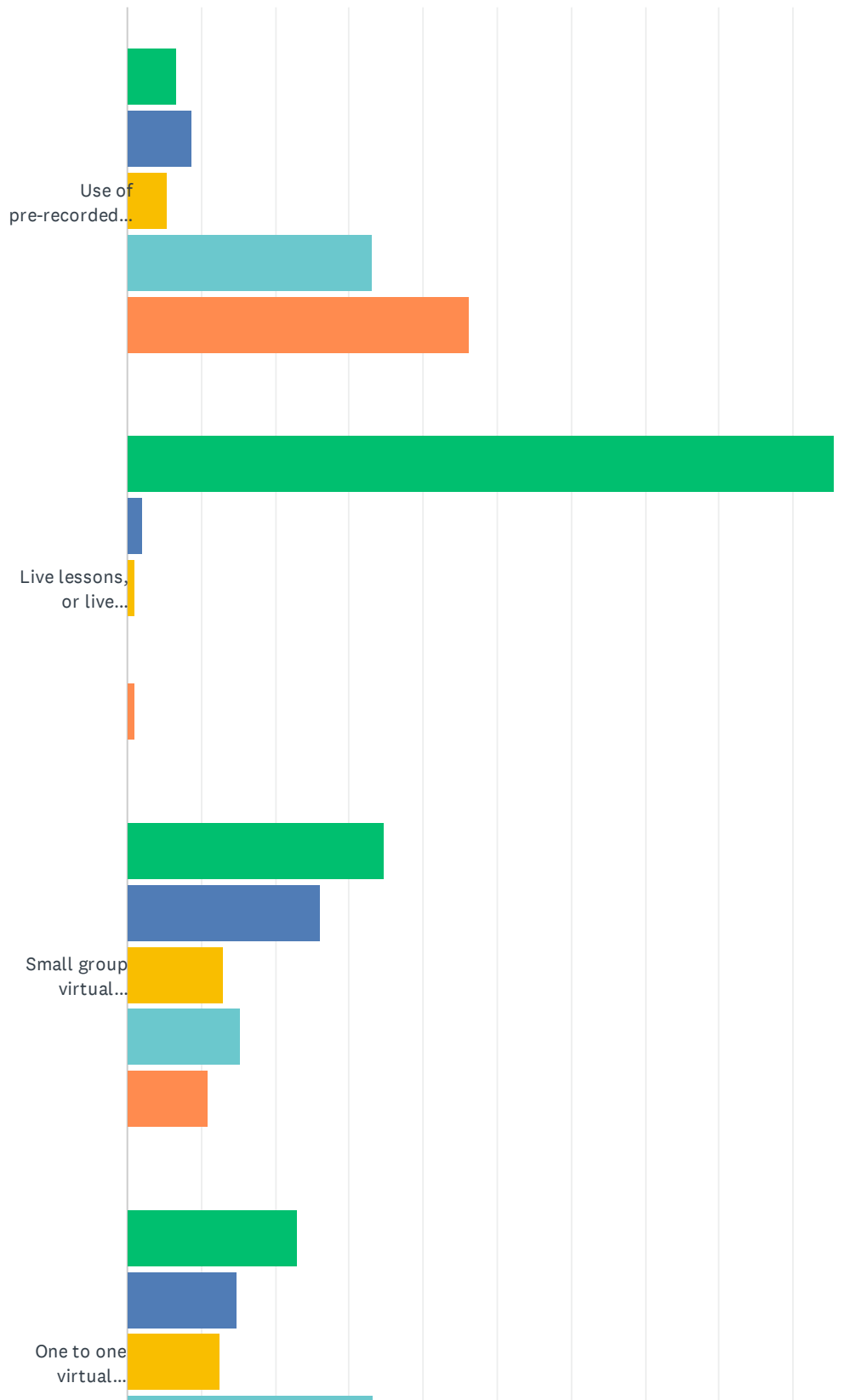

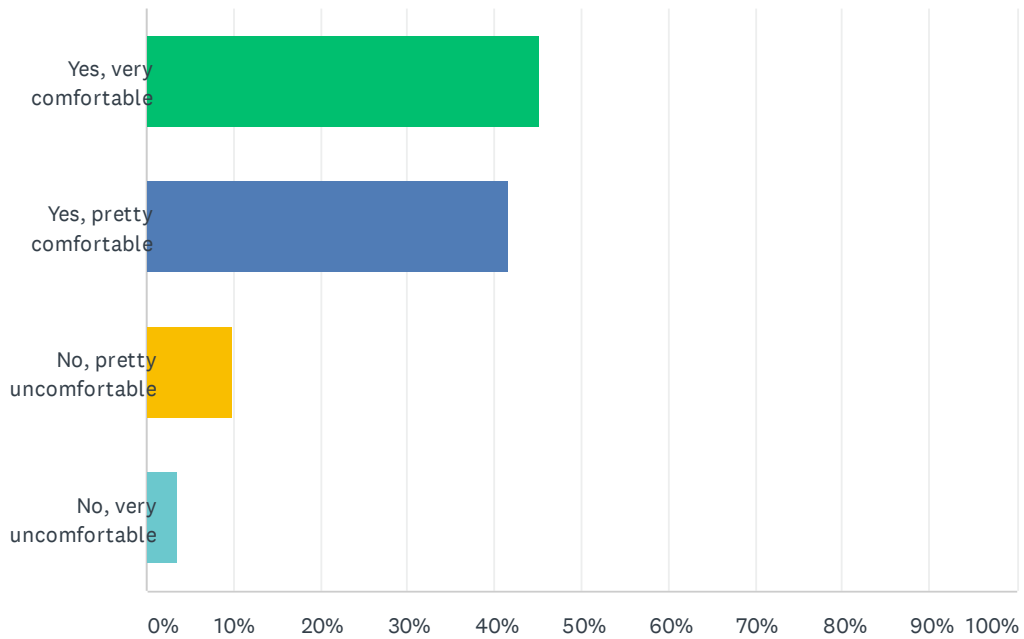

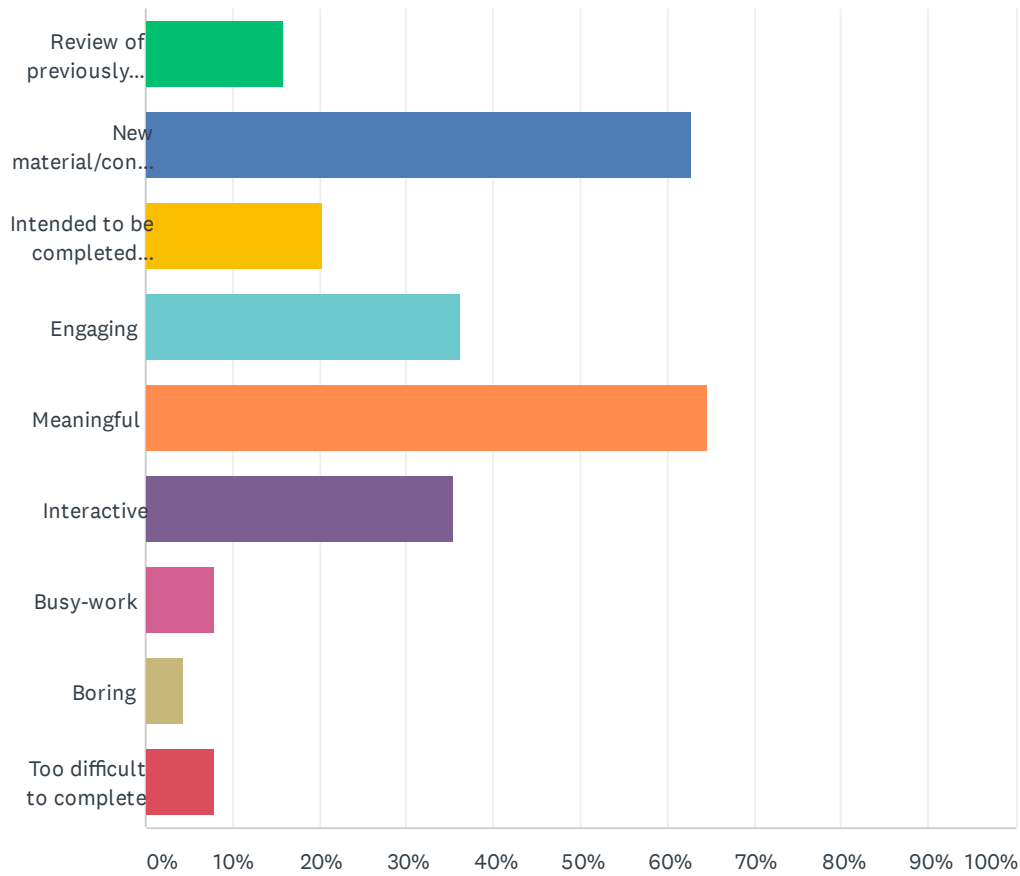

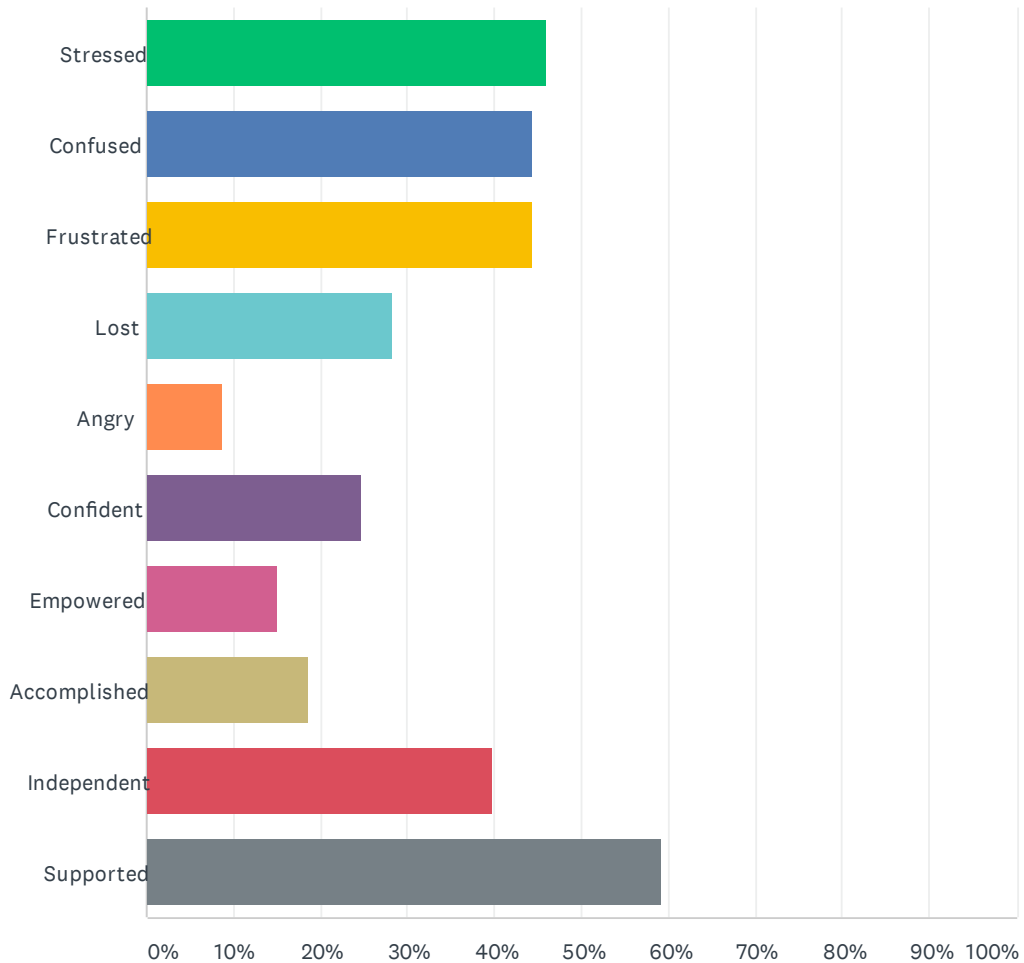

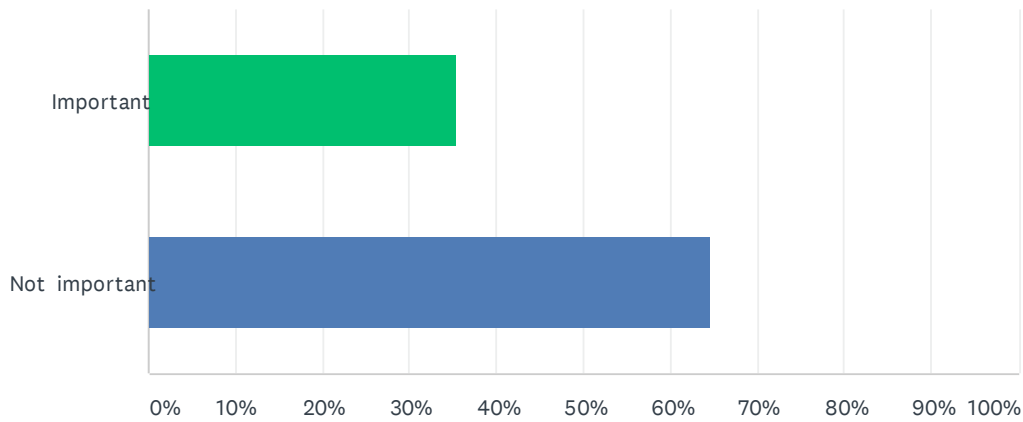

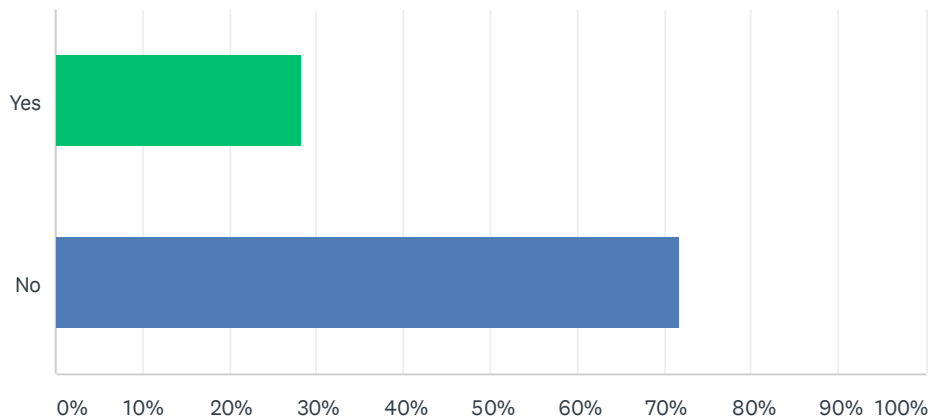

(unless you are trying to quell talk of returning full time with this survey - which is wise). You have many staff members that live throughout the state, including red towns. I get the impression that the general concern regarding the health and well-being of the staff and students of the Seymour Public Schools community has waned since the beginning of the COVID pandemic, which seems to be the trend in the country. Just realize how many bodies that the high school and middle school teachers and staff will be coming in contact with if we were to return full time. I would ask that any administrator, non-classroom teacher, BOE member, parent, or community member that is part of making this decision (and is urging SPS to return full time) to ask themselves how THEY would feel returning into a room with 30 teenagers if they had a compromised immune system or someone high risk at home. Would you be willing to appear and walk through the hallways with them at full capacity knowing that there are most likely unknown, asymptomatic positive students who are putting many staff members at risk. And not just walk through a building one time when the hallways are empty- but remain in the building full time, in close proximity with 15-30 students (or more) at any one time. And have conversations with students at distances of more than 6 feet away - as we approach the winter months. I also have a problem with being exposed to so many more students than an elementary school teacher who may not be in contact with ANY students at this time. We already have disparities in the risk of each staff member depending on the grade/subject they teach. I wish I could teach entirely digital to reduce the risk I face, but I was not provided the same opportunities as other members of my union. I think it remains important to consider the role of each staff member and how returning full time would be equitable among all faculty and staff Seymour Public Schools in terms of protecting the health, safety and well-being of every stakeholder located within our school walls.
