
Q1 What grade are you in this year?



Q2 Which of the choices below describes how you are currently attending school?





Our community, which encompasses the Lower Naugatuck Valley, consists of Ansonia, Beacon Falls, Derby, Naugatuck, Oxford, Seymour and Shelton. 18 new cases were reported since the last report on Friday, October 2nd: Ansonia (+3), Derby (+3), Naugatuck (+5), Seymour (+1), and Shelton (+6). Decisions should also be made around the physical and operational ability of schools to implement critical mitigation strategies (social distancing of 6 feet or more, when feasible, and wearing masks). 


Q4 If we were to re-open schools to a full-five day a week program would you choose to do full-distance learning instead of reporting to the buildings in person?

Q5 What about you, personally? Do you want to be in school full-time?





Q6 Please share your thoughts on in-person, full-time learning


