The Wildcat Athletic Department has enjoyed a successful winter season thus far, and our teams look to continue their strong performances as their seasons wind down.

Some of the highlights of the winter season include:

On January 25, The Varsity Cheerleading Team won 1st place in their competition at Quinnipiac University, while also winning the Bobcat Award for the highest score of the session. The following week, the team took home another 1st place finish in the Ludlowe Open in Fairfield, and were also named Grand Champions of the competition.

The Unified Cheer Team performed at the Wildcat Open on January 18. Their routine was also featured on Channel 3 News!

Anthony (AJ) Deicicchi continues his impressive run in wrestling, representing Seymour on the Derby High School Wrestling Team. This past Saturday, AJ won all three of his matches at the Meyers Invitational Wrestling Meet, and was voted Wrestler of the Tournament.

On February 3, the SHS Dance Team took home 3rd Place at the NVL Championship for their Pom and Jazz Routines. Olivia Kick won the Outstanding Senior Award for the All-NVL Dance Team.

Dion Perkins set the school record for most points scored in a boys' basketball game, scoring 46 points versus Torrington on December 31.

The Indoor Track Team delivered a strong performance at the NVL Meet on February 3. The girls' team finished second place overall, highlighted by sophomore Katie Bruno winning the Top Sprinter Award. The boys' team finished 6th place overall, but increased their score by 29 points over last year's performance.

The Wildcat Boys' Swim Team has been in several competitive meets. Senior Jack Crocamo remains undefeated, and has posted the top NVL time in two events, while also breaking the school record for the 100-yard backstroke. Ethan Mabasa-Hamilton and Zachary Manson have also already qualified for the Class S State Championship Meet.
